There are also two simple Palestinian chants which we can rehearse to better lead the congregation during the service

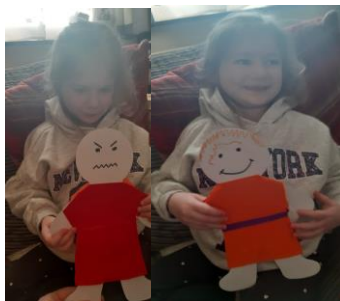
Family Lights New Year update

Sunday 21st January - we explored together what Jesus brought to the world, how we can strengthen ourselves with the armour of God and how our words and actions count as we live our lives for Jesus.



Sunday 28th January - we learnt about the Holy Spirit: that the Holy Spirit is a person not an 'it'; that the Holy Spirit helps us to live out what Jesus has taught us and helps us grow the fruit of the Spirit. We did a craft activity making windmills to help us understand how something we can't see (wind) is actually there and can make something happen.

Sunday 4th February - we stayed in church for Jim & Jennifer's final service and to hear the conclusion of Jim's series on Romans.



Sunday 11th February - we watched an animated film of the story of Saul's conversion and explored how Saul felt, what happened to him and how God can fill us with his Holy Spirit and change us. We did a craft activity making Saul with one side being Saul before and the other side after. We got

brownie ingredients and agreed we wouldn't want to eat the ingredients (oil, egg, powdered cocoa) each on their own but that when we mixed them up and cooked them we ended up with something very tasty - we thought about what we sometimes have to go through and experience to change and become more like Jesus.

Encouragement and Strengthening

The Apostle Peter wrote: *Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience(1 Peter 3:15-16).*

Not everyone is confident when asked to give their testimony. Telling others of Jesus' love may well seem hard for a variety of reasons. Here is one verse and chorus of a song, written by J. Wilbur Chapman (1859-1918), that may help to overcome the nerves. The first verse and chorus is a 30 second testimony which tells of the hope we have in Christ Jesus.

*One day when heaven was filled with His praises,
One day when sin was as black as could be,
Jesus came forth to be born of a virgin,
Dwelt among men, my example is He!
Living, He loved me; dying, He saved me;
Buried, He carried my sins far away;
Rising, He justified freely, forever;
One day He's coming: O glorious day!*

The opening verse and chorus contains the Gospel message of Salvation while the remainder gives more detail to these glorious events

One day they led Him up Calvary's mountain, (John 19:17)

One day they nailed Him to die on the tree; (Luke 23:33)

Suffering anguish, despised and rejected, (Isaiah 53:3)

Bearing our sins, my Redeemer is He! (1 Peter 2:24)

One day they left Him alone in the garden (Matthew 26:36-46)

One day He rested, from suffering free; (John 10:17-18)

Angels came down o'er His tomb to keep vigil; (John 20:12)

Hope of the hopeless, my Saviour is He! (Philippians 4:6-7)

One day the grave could conceal Him no longer, (Acts 2:27)

One day the stone rolled away from the door; (Matthew 28:2-4)

Then He arose, over death He had conquered, (Revelations 1:18)

Now is ascended, my Lord ever more! (Acts 1:6-10)

One day the trumpet will sound for His coming, (1 Thessalonians 4:16)

One day the skies with His glory will shine; (Revelation 1:7)

Open Door Watch List

The World Watch List is **Open Doors'** annual ranking of the 50 countries where Christians face the most extreme persecution. Every year, Open Doors research teams create the **World Watch List**: a list of the countries where Christians face the most severe persecution, ranked from the most extreme. It's a unique, in-depth record of the places where Christians are following Jesus no matter the cost, and research has been gathered and analysed annually since 1993

World Watch List methodology has opted for a theological rather than a sociological definition: ***“Any hostility experienced as a result of one’s identification with Christ. This can include hostile attitudes, words and actions towards Christians”.***

This broad definition includes (but is not limited to) **restrictions, pressure, discrimination, opposition, disinformation, injustice, intimidation, mistreatment, marginalisation, oppression, intolerance, infringement, violation, ostracism, hostilities, harassment, abuse, violence, ethnic cleansing and genocide.** Christian experience is thus considered in five different areas of life – which can be considered 'squeeze' – as well as the final category being the 'smash' of violence:

Private life. What freedom does a Christian have to worship and own religious material? Is conversion to Christianity allowed? Is freedom of thought permitted?

Family life. How free are Christians to express their faith within their family? Is it possible to hold Christian family milestones, such as Christian marriages and funerals?

Community life. Can Christians live without harassment and discrimination in their local communities? How does their faith affect their education or employment?

National life. Does the government allow Christians to express their faith? Can converts call themselves Christians on official documents? Do the police target Christians?

Church life. Are Christians allowed to meet together? Can they build churches? And if they can, are they heavily monitored? Are Bibles freely available?

Violence. Are Christians attacked mentally or physically? Do they face sexual harassment? Are they arrested, abducted, tortured, imprisoned or even killed?

1. North Korea
2. Somalia
3. Libya
4. Eritrea
5. Yemen
6. Nigeria
7. Pakistan
8. Sudan
9. Iran
10. Afghanistan
